

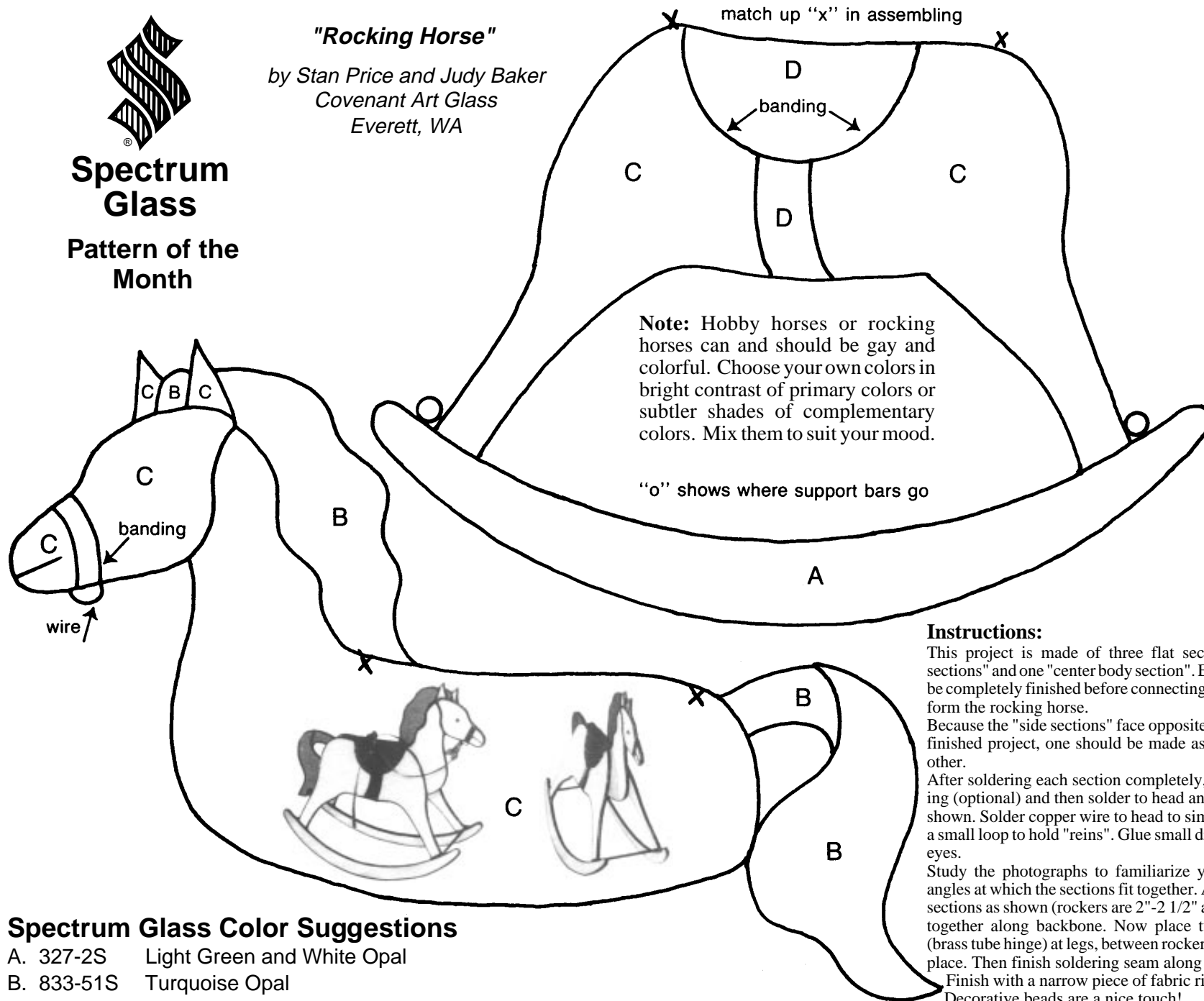

### "Rocking Horse"

**Note:** Hobby horses or rocking horses can and should be gay and colorful. Choose your own colors in bright contrast of primary colors or subtler shades of complementary colors. Mix them to suit your mood.

"o" shows where support bars go

#### Instructions:

This project is made of three flat sections: two "side sections" and one "center body section". Each section must be completely finished before connecting them together to form the rocking horse. Because the "side sections" face opposite directions in the finished project, one should be made as a reverse of the other. After soldering each section completely, shape the banding (optional) and then solder to head and saddle seam as shown. Solder copper wire to head to simulate bridle plus a small loop to hold "reins". Glue small drops of solder for eyes. Study the photographs to familiarize yourself with the angles at which the sections fit together. Arrange the three sections as shown (rockers are 2"-2 1/2" apart) and TACK together along backbone. Now place two support bars (brass tube hinge) at legs, between rockers, and solder into place. Then finish soldering seam along horse's back. Finish with a narrow piece of fabric ribbon for "reins". Decorative beads are a nice touch!
